Programs & Services

HorseNet strives to serve as a “safety net” for horses. In reaching that goal, we have setup several programs and services to aid the horse community. HorseNet takes in horses from any situation to include, abuse, abandonment, neglect, divorce, loss of job, illness to owner or horse, college, losing property, claiming bankruptcy and even death of family member. We serve horse owners from around the country having taken in horses from Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Tennessee, New Jersey, and Virginia.

Alternate Therapies - Many horses that come to HorseNet have not responded to “traditional medicine” so we use alternative therapies to aid in their healing to include; homeopathic and natural remedies, acupuncture, chiropractic, flower essences, massage, Reiki energy work, animal communication and healing techniques. HorseNet is fortunate to have professionals in these fields that donate their expertise.

Education - Horse owner education is a huge part of HorseNet’s mission; Our goal is to educate owners so they can keep their horses. Many times owners are told nothing else can be done and contact us in desperation to help their horse. These owners do not want to euthanize their horses or see them end up at auction or slaughter and hope we can give them a future. Most phone calls start out with “you are my last hope.” It is sad that some “professionals” have not learned how to think out of the box and torment owners this way. How many salvageable horses end up falling through the cracks when alternatives are not even considered? If the horse can stay in a home where they are loved then that is where the horse needs to stay. We have helped keep many of these horses in their loving homes and have educated their owners on other healing modalities outside the mainstream.

Community Service - We are available to children that need to complete their community service hours for school and work with the court system for court appointed community service hours. We are also available to girl / boy scouts wishing to bring their troops to the farm to volunteer and learn.

Training - We encourage first time horse owners to volunteer at the rescue so they can learn how to handle many different problems before being on their own. We feel there is always more to learn and that no one knows “it all.” These training sessions include information on safety and good horse management.

Prayer Pony Program - Our Prayer Pony Program provides little stuffed prayer ponies to shut-ins, elderly or handicapped people with a stuffed pony of their choice along with a history and photo of their chosen pony. Monthly / bi-monthly updates on their pony’s progress will be provided in an effort to give these people a window to the outside world and hopefully a vehicle to transport them outside their problems and depression.
